

The Kano Sector Command spokesperson, Abdullahi Labaran, disclosed that the first incident occurred on Friday night along the Eastern Bypass near the General Muhammadu Buhari Interchange in Hotooro.

The crash involved a DAF trailer transporting goods, animals, and passengers from Wudil Market in Kano to Asaba in Delta State. Investigations revealed that the driver lost control while approaching a flyover, leading to the accident.

Out of 59 individuals involved, 33 sustained injuries, 24 escaped unhurt, and two lost their lives. The injured victims were taken to Murtala Muhammed Specialist Hospital in Kano for treatment.

A second accident occurred on Saturday involving another DAF trailer en route to Lagos. The vehicle reportedly lost control at a T-junction, resulting in two deaths and multiple injuries.

In that incident, 30 individuals were involved—20 were injured, eight escaped unharmed, while two died.

The injured victims were transported to Wudil General Hospital.

The Kano Sector Commander, [Idris Lawal](#), expressed concern over recurring traffic violations, particularly the dangerous practice of transporting passengers in trailers designed for goods.
