

Bandits Kill Niger Staff Nurse On Way To Work

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Bandits have killed a staff nurse, Bala Musa Allawa, along the Pandogari-Kalgara road in Rafi local government area of Niger State.

The bandits attacked the nurse while on his way to work at the General Hospital Kagara, from Pandogari where he resided.

Our correspondent gathered that Allawa ran into the bandits who were suspected to be aiming a village along Pandogari road.

Governor Mohammed Umaru Bago, has expressed sorrow on the killing, describing it as senseless.

In a message through his chief press secretary, Bologi Ibrahim, the governor condemned the incident saying it came at a time when the deceased and other workers were to be celebrated for their sacrifices and contributions to humanity.

The governor said the killing of Allawa was a painful reminder of the risks many frontline personnel face in the line of duty.

He maintained that the loss of Allawa was a great loss not only to his immediate family but also

to the entire state, considering his selflessness and dedication to providing healthcare services to the people.

He also commiserated with the Emir of Kagara, Alhaji Ahmed Gunna Attahiru II and the entire people of Kagara, the deceased's host community.

"I am pained by the killing of this hardworking nurse, and I truly

mourn him. I assure you that his sacrifices and those of others who are frontline workers will never be taken for granted," the governor said.
