Osun Amotekun corps dies in Ondo road crash



...APC chair berate deployment of corps outside Osun

An operative of Western Nigeria Security Network (WNSN), Osun State, codenamed Amotekun Corps, Akinola Adediji died after being involved in an accident en route to Ajebandele in **Ondo state**.

The mother of the deceased, Fausat Adediji confirmed the death of his son when she was visited by executives of All Progressives Congress (APC) led by Egbedore Chairman, Yisa Akinwale.

Mrs Adediji disclosed that, "Akinola was redeployed from Osun State to Ajebandele in Ondo State, the powerplant of the elder brother of Governor Ademola Adeleke. He was on his way to the new place of his assignment when he had accident."

She said Akinola was rushed to hospital for treatment but later died as a result of internal injuries he sustained from the road crash.

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The distraught mother revealed that the leadership of Amotekun reached out to her and the wife of the deceased.

Meanwhile, the APC chairman of Egbedore local government, Akinwale berated the Osun State Government and Amotekun leadership for diversion of corps for governor's family protection interest.

He recalled that APC Campaign Council through its Director General, Hon. Oluwole Oke, had protested over alleged deployment of 50 Amotekun operatives had been illegally deployed outside the state's borders to secure a private energy facility.

He said, "Osun Amotekun should only operate within Osun, they are not responsible to secure private facilities. The leadership of Amotekun is illegally using his officers to secure a personal property in another state, which is outrightly wrong. It is not the motive for creating the outfit."

The APC chairman demanded the redeployment of other corps drafted to private property in Ondo State, adding that, "this is the best time that we need Amotekun to secure our borders across the state at a time when bandits are trying to infiltrate southwest states."
