

Two die in Ogun truck, bus collision

Two persons have been confirmed dead following a road crash involving a Mack truck and a Peugeot J5 bus at Ogbere Junction on the Ogbere–J4 corridor in Ogun State.

Spokesperson, Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), Ogun Sector Command, Afolabi Odunsi, said the accident occurred about 5:10 a.m. yesterday, attributing the crash to route violation and excessive speed.

According to Odunsi in a statement, the crash involved a white Mack truck with registration number ABC660XC and an orange Peugeot J5 bus with an unknown registration number.

Four adult male occupants were involved in the accident; two died on the spot, while the others escaped unhurt.

The FRSC said the impact of the collision caused the Peugeot J5 bus to burst into flames, leaving its front section burnt.



Rescue personnel from the Corps, he added, arrived at the scene in two minutes of receiving the distress call and commenced rescue and traffic control.

According to him, traffic was diverted to the alternative carriageway to ease congestion while officials cleared the wreckage from the road.

The bodies of the deceased were evacuated by operatives of the Nigeria Police Motor Traffic Division (MTD), Ogbere Division, and deposited at a nearby mortuary.
