

Four die, eight injured in Ogun lone crash

A lone crash involving a Toyota Hiace bus around Christopher University, along the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway in Mowe, Ogun State, on Sunday, reportedly left four people dead and eight injured.

The accident occurred at about 9:18 p.m. when a bus carrying 13 people, suspected to have been travelling at high speed, suffered a burst tyre, leading to the crash.

The spokesperson for the Ogun State Sector Command of the Federal Road Safety Corps, Afolabi Odunsi-Oyewole, disclosed this in a statement made available to journalists on Monday.

Odunsi-Oyewole said the injured were immediately evacuated to Famobis Hospital for urgent medical attention, while the deceased had been deposited at the Idera Morgue.



He explained, “The Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), Ogun State Sector Commander, Corps Commander Akinwunmi Fasakin, regrettably wishes to inform the general public of the lone crash which claimed four lives.

“The FRSC Mowe Unit Command responded to the fatal lone traffic crash involving a commercial Toyota Hiace bus on the night of Sunday, April 5, 2026.

“The incident occurred at approximately 21:18 hrs directly in front of Christopher University on the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway. FRSC rescue teams arrived at the scene within two minutes of being alerted.

“Total persons involved: 13 (11 adult males, 2 adult females). Injured: 8 (7 adult males, 1 adult female). Fatalities: 4 (all adult males). Vehicle details: White Toyota Hiace bus, registration number AGL789YL.

“Preliminary investigations suggest the crash was caused by tyre burst (TBS) and speed violation (SPV), leading the driver to lose control of the vehicle.

“Injured victims were immediately evacuated to Famobis Hospital for urgent medical attention. The deceased were conveyed to the Idera Morgue, “ he also said.

Odunsi-Oyewole said the Motor Traffic Division of the Redeemed Police Station had taken custody of the crashed vehicle, along with all recovered properties and luggage belonging to the passengers, for further investigation and safekeeping.

Meanwhile, the Sector Commander, Akinwunmi Fasakin, commiserated with the families of the deceased and prayed for the quick recovery of the injured.

He also reminded motorists to strictly adhere to speed limits and ensure their tyres are in good condition, especially during the Easter period and beyond.
