

Insecurity: Mother, Daughter Killed In Poultry Farm Attack In Ondo

...Police Rescue Abducted Two Persons

[Gunmen](#) attacked a poultry farm at Igushin via Ala in Akure South Local Government Area of [Ondo State](#), killing the owner and her daughter in an incident that has left residents of the community in shock.

An eyewitness said the attackers, believed to be about five armed men, reportedly gained access to the poultry premises by scaling the fence.



According to the report, As of the time of the incident, the poultry owner was said to be at work with her daughter, sister, and other workers.

The witness said the assailants initially abducted three persons during the raid, creating panic within the area. However, the lifeless bodies of the poultry owner and her daughter were later discovered within the premises, indicating they had been killed during the attack.

The eyewitness said "The attackers came in through the fence. They were about five in number and took three people away. Later, we found the woman who owns the poultry and her daughter dead."

The people in the community alerted the state police command who responded swiftly. Through what authorities described as a coordinated rescue operation, two of the abducted victims were successfully freed from the captors.

Confirming the death and abduction at the community, the Police Public Relation Officer (PPRO), Abayomi Jimoh condemned the heinous violent incident at Igushin via Ala, Akure, which led to the tragic loss of two innocent lives.

Jimoh in a statement said "While two victims were successfully rescued through a swift and coordinated operation, the Command expresses deep sorrow over the unfortunate deaths recorded.

"Command assures the people that adequate security measures have been put in place to ensure security of lives and property while efforts are ongoing to apprehend the perpetrators, and the Command also assures the public that those responsible will be brought to justice."

The police spokesman urged residents to remain vigilant and cooperate with security agencies by providing timely and useful information.
