Police were unable to confirm how many people had been on board the bus


At least 10 people were killed when a power cable fell on a bus in Port Harcourt, southern Nigeria, and electrocuted passengers, police say.

"Twelve others who went to assist the victims suffered severe burns", Rivers State police spokeswoman Rita Abbey told the AFP news

An Associated Press cameraman saw 10 bodies charred beyond recognition at a local hospital.

Ms Abbey said the injured had been hospitalised.

Police were unable to confirm how many people had been aboard the bus and how many survived the accident.
