Human Rights Activist, Chidi Nwosu Shot dead

December 29, 2010



The President of the Human Rights, Justice and Peace foundation (HRJPF) Comrade Chidi Nwosu was killed in the early hours of Wednesday, December 29, 2010 in his home town

family source revealed that Comrade Chidi Nwosu was trailed into his house by armed men at about 1 am and shot dead.

The assailants locked up his 5 year old daughter and wife in the toilet before taking on the 39 year old human rights activist.

Comrade Nwosu who was survived by his wife, daughter and aged parents was known for his fight against human rights violations in

Nigeria with particular focus on his home state, � Abia in Southeast Nigeria.

In a swift reaction to Nwosu⊕s death, the Campaign for Democracy [CD], which Nwosu chaired before his demise said his death is a "rude shock"

The group noted that the account given by his wife, Amaka indicates that Chidi Nwosu was murdered in his country home in Amaeke (Arochukwu Local Government, Abia State) as he returned a wake keep at about 12:48am today.

According to the CD "the gunmen reportedly scaled the fence to gain access into his house just as he was entering; they there after locked his wife and daughter in the toilet before killing him. Chidi was 39 and survived by his wife, daughter and aged parents.

"The Campaign for Democracy calls on the Inspector General of Police to cause a thorough investigation into this dastardly murder, to ensure that the assailants are brought to book.

"The Campaign for Democracy (CD) sends condolence to his family and prays that God will grant them the fortitude to bear the irreparable loss.

"May the spirit of Chidi Nwosu continue to haunt his killers and their sponsor(s) until the long arm of the law catches up with them".

The CD said in a statement signed by the President, Dr. Joe Okei-Odumakin "Our heart bleed that the civil rule that took the sweat and blood of many is being put into jeopardy by mindless acts".
