At the Federal Medical Centre, the victims were seen receiving treatment at emergency wards.


One of the survivors said they were coming from Abuja and heading to Benin when it occurred.

He said that the **accident** happened when one of the drivers wrongfully overtook an articulated lorry, leading to the head-on collision with the second bus.


The Sector Commander of the Federal Road Safety Corp, Kogi State Command, Mr. Sunday Maku, confirmed the accident but said only two people lost their lives, stressing that one male and female were confirmed dead.


Maku stated that the accident occurred as a result of over speeding and wrongful overtaking.
