## Father calls for probe over son's death

TNSPECTOR-General of Police (IGP) has been called to direct the Enugu State command to unravel the mystery surrounding the death of one Mr. Kachisicho Paul Okafor, a first year computer science student of Caritas University, Amorji, Nike, Enugu.

In a petition to IGP which was copied to Assistant Inspector-General of Police (AIG), Zone 9, and the Enugu State Commissioner of Police. Kachisicho's father. Chief Okafor said the Emene Police Station currently handling the case lacked the expertise and experience to unravel the circumstance surrounding the death.

In the petition written by Chief Okafor's lawyer, Mr. P. A. Ogwuche, he said IGP's intervention was necessary to stop any cover-up in the death of the student and as well as to preserve vital evidence.

According to the petition, Kachisicho came home, to their village, Nnokwa, Idemili South council area of Anambra State last September 16, to attend a wedding apparently without permission and returned to school the following day.

Four days later September 20, the University's Vice-Chancellor, Prof. R. Unegbu it was alleged called Chief Okafor's attention in the school and was told that his son was dead when he got there.

He was told that his son died by drowning in water reservoir, but when demanded to see his son's corpse, the Vice-Chancellor said it had been deposited at University of Nigeria Teaching Hospital (UNTH), Enugu, mortuary.

Surprised at the urgency with which his son was deposited at the mortuary, demanded Chief Okafor to see the reservoir where he was drowned, a request that elicited sharp reaction from the Vice Chancellor who asked Chief Okafor if he wanted to conduct the investigation himself.

Curiously, without Chief Okafor, the Investigating Police Officer (IPO) from Emene Police Station had embalmed the corpse last September 20, without autopsy.

Chief Okafor information from the school showed that the boy died as a result of torture on the order of the Vice Chancellor for leaving school without permission.
