Family of 7 perish in fire

A middle-aged man, his mother and five children, were at the weekend, in Dutsen Tanshe, Bauchi, burnt to death, with the wife in critical condition at the state Specialist Hospital.

In a swift reaction, Governor Adamu Mu'azu has donated N3 million to assist the wife and a

surviving son, who escaped the inferno.

The deceased was identified by neighbours as Alhaji Umar Dukku, a businessman and former staff of Federal Mortgage Bank in Bauchi.

A source told our correspondent that the midnight inferno which engulfed late Dukku's Dutsen Tanshe apartment, Friday, was allegedly
