

Robbers kill 4 in bus raid

BARELY three days after three people were killed in an armed robbery incident in Apapa, Lagos, another four persons including the driver and conductor of a Lagos-based luxury bus were yesterday shot dead in another robbery incident in Ojota area of the state.

The trigger-happy armed robbers apart from robbing and killing four of their victims, left several others wounded and equally set the bus, belonging to a popular transport company ablaze.

The incident came just as the state commissioner of Police, Mr. Emmanuel Adebayo paraded 59 robbery suspects, including those who killed six policemen

at Abule Egba as well as those who recently robbed banks and traders at Alaba International market, Ojo.

Daily Champion learnt that the latest incident occurred around 6 am at the bridge linking Ojota and Maryland. When the bus, said to have loaded from Onitsha, Anambra State

attempted to disembark some passenger at Ojota."

An eyewitness said the robbery suspects tried the bus from Ore, after Benin in Edo State, and attempted severally to block the bus but the driver successfully outsmarted them in the high way.

PDP's constitution amendment, a fraud - Enahoro

ELDER statesman and founder of the National Reformation party (NRP) Chief Anthony Enahoro yesterday carpeted the leadership of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) over the recent amendment in the party's constitution, which he said gives the chairman of the party's Board of Trustees (BOT) powers over to former civilian president of Nigeria.

Chief Enahoro described

the said amendment as not only fraudulent but dictatorial and has made the President of Nigeria subordinate to the chairman of the PDP Board of Trustees.

He spoke at his residence in Benin City yesterday and announced the postponement of the NRP's national congress scheduled to take place today, Thursday.
