# Couple, 5 children die in generator tragedy a generating set.

TRAGEDY struck in ljegun, I Ikotun, Lagos yesterday as a couple and five children died in their sleep after inhaling carbon monoxide emitted from

Daily Champion learnt man however that a identified as Chukwudi who was on a visit to the family when the incident occurred survived. He is currently receiving medical attention at Lagos State University Teaching Hospital (LASU), Ikeja.

Our correspondent learnt that trouble started when the couple switched on the generating set and forgot to put if off before going to sleep. A witness who pleaded for anonymity said the family. following persistent power failure, in the area bought a generating set to enable them power their Continues on Page 6

two room apartment.

According to him, the couple and children slept and gradually inhaled the carbon monoxide which suffocated them, adding the neighbours found out that the victims were unconscious and raised alarm which attracted others at about 6.30 am.

He added that the entire family including husband and wife were unconscious apparently, due to carbon monoxide they inhaled.

Our correspondent also learnt that neighbours immediately rushed the victims to hospital for urgent medical attention but they later died at the hospital after few hours of admission.

The father of the deceased children identified as innocent and his wife were said to have died before their children.

Confirming the incident, Lagos State Police spokesman, Mr Olubode Ojajuni said the incident, which he described as tragic, occurred at Oluwole Lawson Street, Ijegun, Ikotun.

According to the Superintendent of Police "One Innocent Orukpe was found unconscious with his family of six, apparently due to carbon monoxide they inhaled from exhaust of their generating set".

Ojajuni said, policemen on hearing the incident, raced to the scene and assisted. neighbours in rushing the victims to the hospital where

they later died.

He noted that victims were rushed to (LASUTH) Ikeja for medical attention, adding that the husband, wife and children died at the hospital within few hours of admission.

He also confirmed a man who was on friendly visit to the family is in critical condition, adding that police have begun investigations into the matter.
