2 corps members die in auto crash

TWO National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) members in Ondo state died on Tuesday in a motor accident along First Bank road Alagbaka, Akure, while another corps member cheated death in the accident as he was rushed to a nearby hospital for treatment by men of the state's fire service.

Daily Champion could not ascertain the identities of the corps members as at the time of going to press. Their corpses have since been deposited at the mortuary.

Vehicular movement was obstructed for over 30 minutes as sympathizers joined the men of the fire service to rescue the only survivor.

They were coming from an eatery in a white bus with

inscription Nigerian Christian Corpers Fellowship before they met their untimely death.

Eye witnesses told Daily Champion that the bus occupied by the corps members suddenly hit a street light pole along the Alagbaka road.

The Sector Commander, Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC), Ondo State , Mr. Ahmed Hassan however said he was not aware of the accident.

But a top official of the state fire service who confirmed the incident does not want his name in print.
