Govt extends curfew in Port Harcourt

AT least 28 persons were feared killed Wednesday night in a renewed communal violence at Rumuekpe in the Emohua local government area of Rivers State.

The development came as the state government extended, by one week, the dusk to dawn curfew it imposed on Port Harcourt, the state capital.

The invaders were said to have been brought in by a factional leader of a youth group, having taken their opponents unawares as they were said to have gone round
