He called on the Anambra state government to equally complement his effort to attract federal assistance to his people adding that he would moblize his fellow senators from the zone for a strong case to be made to the presidency.



He urged the federal government to declare a state of emergency on that road since lives and property worth several millions of naira were destroyed by the flood. He said that the situation would not have been worse if construction were done on the roads by the federal or state aovernment.

IN ADDITION TO THE 2007 ELECTORAL LANDSLIDE? THAT'S SERIOUS

While expressing optimism that President Yar'Adua would harkens to the pleas of the good sons of Obosi and people of Anambra state to direct for immediate work on that road, Senator Okonkwo asked the protesting youths and community leaders to exercise patience as the work would be done by the federal government even as he informed them that Governor Obi would be asked to assist with a palliative measure on the road.

Responding, the President General of the Obosi Development Union Mr Chukwurah Ifekandu and an industrialist in the Obosi bye pass Chief Eddy Onwumelu lamented that the erosion menace was caused by the Consolidated Construction Company ( CCC) sequel to wrong channeling of gutters and unconcerned attitude of the firm as they were informed hour by hour information on the deteriorating condition of the road without them doing anything until the road was cut into two by erosion.
