2 dead as PDP members clash

A FIKPO town in Afipko North local government area of Ebonyi state has witnessed violent clashes among rival political opponents within the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) with two persons confirmed dead. while properties worth several millions of naira were destroyed during the party's primaries for councillorship aspirants in Egwuegu ward.

Fear of reprisal attacks has forced many indigenes of the area to run for dear life while youths embarked on rampage with a vow to get those behind the killings.

The primaries are in preparation for the forthcoming council elections slated for December 20 by the Ebonyi State Independent National Electoral Commission (EBSIEC).

Confirming the incident to newsmen, the Councillor representing the ward, Hon. Otu Christian said that violence broke out in the area following alleged killing of one Ikechukwu Eze. a student of Akanu Ibiam Federal Polytechnic. Unwana, by thugs believed to be working for one of the councillorship aspirants.

"Once they don't allow the will of the people to prevail, we'll continue to be he ing this type of risis. Already a house belonging to Mr. Ogbu Egwurochi has been burnt down and more things are still happening. This whole thing carted when we heard that our brother, Ez as killed by thuas working for

an aspirant.

"The aspirant is already on the run, but the youths who went after the thugs were able to catch one of them who confessed that they were sent by the aspirant. He was also burnt to death. This is only but primaries for the councillorship aspirants and people are being killed," he narrated, while pleading wit the youths to allow peace to reign.

When contacted, the traditional ruler of the community, Ezeogo John Egwu confirmed the incident, but stated that efforts were currently being made to restore normalcy to the area. He said the matter had been reported to the police at Afikpo.

Meanwhile, following the desertion of the area by indigenes, the community has become a ghost of itself.

Efforts to get the Police Public Relation Officer, Noudam Frederick and the Chairman of the PDP in the state Chief Dave Umahi to comment on the development proved abortive.

While the PPRO was said to be away from the state, the PDP Chairman was said to be busy with the collation of the primaries' results at one of the hotels in Abakaliki, the state

In his remarks, Chairman Caretaker Committee of Emohua local government area, Chief Allwell Igbor advised the people of Rumuekpe to abide by the decision of the committee to pave way for peace in the community.
