4 killed as fire razes house in Lagos

AT least four persons were feared dead and property worth millions of nora razed yesterday, at the Peoples' Plaza, near Mandilas building on Lagos Island.

Daily Champion learnt that the yet-to-be identified victims were still being trapped in the rubbles.

A witness told our

correspondent at the scene of the incident that the fire, which gutted three buildings including a six-storey building started at about 7pm on Wednesday and raged on till yesterday's afternoon.

The witness, who preferred anonymity, traced the cause of the fire to electrical fault occasioned by power fluctuations.
