

# 2 robbers killed in Warri

**T**HE men of the quick response squad over the weekend gunned down two robbery suspects along the ever busy airport road in Warri, Delta State.

The suspects had attempted to escape after dispossessing a woman who was going to the church of her belonging.

*Daily Champion* gathered that the bandits who were armed with dangerous weapon had earlier robbed several people of their possession at different points using a motor cycle.

But luck ran out of them when they attacked and robbed a woman and her family who were going to church at about 10am, taking all her belongings including

GSM handsets.

The woman immediately raised alarm which attracted passers by and getting the information, the Quick Response team, led by its Commander, Ukim Kingsley, a superintendent of police, swoops into action and were able to trace the fleeing robbers and gunned them down.

But sources said the robbers who were engaged in a cross fire with the police, were terribly hit by the bullet, a situation which crippled and spoilt their day.

Dependable sources said they were subsequently arrested but while they were being taken to the hospital they gave up the ghost on the way.

Several dangerous weapons were recovered from them, which included pistols with three live cartridges, battle axe and others.

Contacted, the coordinator of the squad, Superintendent confirmed the story but said the matter has been reported to the State police command.

He, however, warned criminals to flee from Warri as

the place is becoming too hot for them on a daily basis.

He attributed the success of his men in combing the area to the dedication and hardwork to duty, adding that criminals will be smoked out of the oil city and environs within the shortest possible period.

It would be recalled that the quick response Squad recently killed four notorious armed robbers along the Warri/Benin road recovering sophisticated arms and ammunitions.
