victim lady may have been lured to the isolated area by her assailants.

The lifeless body of the victim was turned, with her face upwards, as sources intimated Sunday Champion that it was exactly the way her attackers left her naked.

Those behind the heinous crime are no where to be found, as the police have begun a manhunt for the assailants.

Reliable sources said a teamof Police men from the state command arrived the scenewith a private car yesterday morning and conveyed her corpse to the Eederal Medical Centre (FMC), morgue in-Yenagoa, the state capital.

Our correspondent also leant that the lady may have struggled without success for her life and was eventually subdued by her attackers.

Blood stains, tissue paper, lady's pant pieces of cloth, lady's purse and littered carelessly on the ground, between a paim plantation and the uncompleted building.

Efforts to reach the Police Public Relations Officer, Mr. Ibokette Iniobong (DSP) proved abortive as his mobile phone was not available.

But a close police source said the state command is already aware of the incident, saying investigations are on top gear to track down the hoodlums.
