If it was the real cause of the accident, it was not ascertained.

Actually there was a pot hole before the scene of the accident, but it was not ascertained, if the pothole was the real cause of the accident.

Another eye-witness alleged that the driver of the waste truck was playing a Video CD while driving. He told the newsmen that he was among the few people who rushed to the scene to put off the video CD.

But it was not certain where the Mitsubishi bus was coming from and its destination. However, reports from the Lagos Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO) stated that the Mitsubishi bus was conveying members of a church from Obalande. It also confirmed the death of 10 passengers and added that five of them were still under intensive care at lkeja General Hospital.

Paul Azuka, a staff of Afprint,

a company that had part of its wall destroyed as a result of the accident, said it happened at about 12 noon and some rescue team came about 35 minutes after the incident to assist the people involved but could not because their Crane was unable to lift up the waste bin truck that was lying on top of the Mitsubishi bus.

A renewed effort was then made by some policemen around to bring a stronger

Crane. While, this was going on, one of the passengers who was trapped in the Mitsubishi bus under the truck cried for help, while many of them were already dead.

He said three hours after the incident, a Julius Berger company Crane of 80 tons, came and lifted the truck to enable passengers who were trapped inside the Mitsubishi bus to be rescued.


According to him, only three persons, a man and two women, survived the accident and were rushed to Ikeja General hospital by an ambulance.

One of the police women at the scene, who couldn't give her name but said that she from Area D police Command, Mushin, said that she met nine of the passengers including a baby already dead at the time she arrived.

The accident obstructed the flow of traffic along the service lane before lyana isolo bus stop as sympathisers, police and rescue team crowded the road.

Meanwhile, policemen from Aswani Police Station who were on investigation, reported that they have recovered some identity cards to help individuals to identify the bodies of their relatives.

According to them, efforts were being made to recover more identity cards.
