## Abia: 3 killed as robbers invade police station

THREE suspected armed robbers yesterday met their waterloo in Abia State following a botched attempt to raid the Eastern Obingwa Police station in Obingwa local government area of the state.

Briefing journalists while displaying bullet-ridden bodies of the criminals at the state

police headquarters in Umuahia, the state commissioner of Police, Mr. Jonathan Johnson, said the hoodlums numbering about five and armed with sophisticated weapons at about 1 p.m., drove into the police station in a Mercedes Benz saloon car and started shooting indiscriminately.

As they continued their shooting spree, two gallant

police constables courageously confronted them and instantly gunned down three of the gang members while the other two fled

The police, however, did not record any casualty in the attack.

The police boss expressed worry over why criminals should continue to make the police the target of their attacks even without provocation, as this was the fourth attack on the police

station in recent times.

He, therefore, appealed to criminals in the state to embrace the on-going amnesty programme of the Federal Government in collaboration with the state government and surrender their weapons for rehabilitation.

A police source, however told Daily Champion that the criminals probably wanted to test the superiority of their fire arms as the police cell was empty as at the time of the attack.

It would be recalled that the attack is coming barely one week after the state government in partnership with the Federal Government renewed its amnesty programme with an appeal to criminals to surrender their arms and be rehabilitated.

Meanwhile, the recent order by the Inspector-General of Police, Mr. Ogbonna Onovo, for the dismantling of police road blocks in the South East zone has been greeted with mixed reactions as some residents expressed anxiety that criminals would take undue advantage of the directive to unleash more terror on the public.

But the Abia Police Commissioner while reacting to the directive, advised residents not to panic as the command had put in place high security personal any
