Last week, eight persons died as soldiers and militants battled to take control of the camp in Foropa. During the exchange of gunfire which lasted several hours, weapons and maps of oil installations were seized.

The military had earlier alerted about the attacks: "We have observed with concern some criminal acts within the past few days by some people claiming to be militants. Many of these criminals are known to be hiding in camps within the creeks of the Niger Delta," Chief of Defence Staff Oluseyi Petinrin said in a statement.

"These camps will no longer be tolerated. To avoid any collateral damage, we are seizing this opportunity to instruct all law-abiding citizens who live around the vicinity of these camps to leave immediately," the statement

This came on the heels of the threat by the Movement for the Emancipation of the Niger Delta (MEND) to carry out a major operation that will affect all oil facilities in the area. MEND also claimed responsibility for Sunday's attack on Exxon Mobil in Akwa Ibom state.

Part of the statement by JTF read: "You will recall that in the last few weeks, criminal gangs masquerading as militants have been engaging in all atrocities, like kidnapping, sea robbery and illegal boarding of oil

production platforms

"The JTF is currently in an operation to rid the Niger Delta of these criminal elements, in order for the region to experience the needed peace and security which are imperatives for sustainable development

"All law abiding indigenes of communities hosting these criminals are advised to remain clam and promptly report suspicious characters to relevant military authorities.

Meanwhile, MEND has said the attack on the Exxon Mobil facility located at Ibeno in Akwa Ibom state was carried out by its fighters.

In a statement signed by its spokesperson, Gbomo Jomo and forwarded to our correspondent, the group said the attack lasted for two hours "after our fighters, detonated
