pleaded for anonymity, said, "when he got to the mechanic workshop, he was joined by another senior colleague, a Divisional Crime Officer (DCO) attached to the Inland police station, which is just few poles away".

The source stated that while they were discussing, two unidentified gunmen pulled up their motorcycle about a pole away and immediately opened fire on the DSP who was backing the road, stating, "the assailants may have been trailing him from the office and the manner in which they shot at him suggested that they were out to assassinate him at all cost".

He said that having shot and killed the police officer, the gunmen sped off in their motorcycle, while his colleague escaped unhurt, "the assailants were armed with AK47 Riffles and they shot the officer at a very close range and the bullets pierced his heart and he died instantly".

The death of DSP Ochiobi, is bringing to two the number of senior police officers attached to the Central Police Station that were killed by gunmen in less than four weeks.

When Daily Champion visited the Central Police Station, Policemen who were in mourning mood, were seen in little groups

apparently discussing the sudden death of their colleague who was described by some of them as a hard working and dedicated police officer.
