

Okada robbers kill Danfo driver

TWO dare devil armed robbery suspects have killed a commercial driver at the FESTAC link bridge while carrying out their operation.

The robbers, who were on a bike, allegedly trailed the occupant of the commercial bus from 22 Road where the owner of the money lodged.

Eye witness said the robbers attempted to stop the Danfo driver but the driver refused to comply which compelled the robbers to shoot him at close range.

After killing the driver, the robbers still carted away the money staked inside Ghana-Must-Go bag and fled without challenge from the police patrol team at the Apple junction.

In a related development, rampaging armed robbery suspects killed an unidentified business man who was returning from Republic of Cotonou and carted away the monies in his brief case.

The business man was shot severally on the abdomen by his captors while attempting to escape.

Also Daily Champion gathered that another set of robbers, numbering over 10, purportedly invaded a community at Iganri Alimosho Local Government Area on Monday and killed

a security man.

Our correspondent learnt that a joint team of policemen from both Igando, Idimu and Iyana Ipaja pursued the robbers but they robbers fled through the bush.

Daily Champion investigation revealed that the robbers came with sophisticated weapons, including AK 47s and cordoned off all entrances and exits in the area to enable them operate without hindrances.

A witness in one of the houses invaded said: "They scaled through the fence at about 1.30am and cut off the burglary proof leading to the kitchen. We were in the ground floor in the duplex and they gathered all of us together while looking for oga. It was like somebody who knew the terrain of the building was there or they were drilled about the environment. They met oga with ease and he gave them money. The robbers further collected the key of his jeep to further search it to find out whether he kept some money inside it but they could not find any."

However, Police spokesman, Ngozi Braide, said the police would fish them out no matter how high they hid.
