According to Junior, "after the electric shock, the three of them were lying helplessly on the ground. People came to the scene, but nobody had the courage to help them because it was electric. We were all afraid.

"But when I looked closely, I saw that one of them (Abraha) who is my friend was still moving his body, so I immediately rushed, held him and asked people to bring milk. I gave him the milk to drink and there was still life in him when we rushed to him to

Weekend Champion however gathered that two of the boys were confirmed dead at an undisclosed hospital in Port Harcourt, but that the third victim was lucky to have been revived in the hospital.

Our correspondent who visited the scene of the electrocution about 2:45pm reports that sympathizers were in groups discussing the unfortunate incident, even as some who knew the victims personally were spotted in tear-filled eyes.

Also, a middle-aged lady and relative of one of the deceased broke down in tears on the discovery that her cousin was among the victims, even as the owner of the restaurant, who they were trying to assist to get clearer TV pictures had closed shop for the day.

It was also gathered that one of the deceased started work at the restaurant barely two weeks ago, while the second dead victim was said to be doing menial job in a transport company located along the busy lkwerre Road.

Contacted, Rivers State Police Public Relations Officer, PPRO, Ben Ugwuegbulam confirmed that there was a case of electrocution, but that he was yet to receive official briefing from the Divisional Police Officer (DPO) in charge of Mile 1 area.

Ugwuegbulam said, "That is what I am trying to find out. I am trying to reach the DPO of Mile 1 to get the detail of the incident."
