## Accidents claim 10 in Lagos

Hourteen péople died in two fatal accidents on a Lagos bridge

yesterday.

A bus conveying 18 people crashed into a culvert.

flipping over several times and throwing 10 people into the lagoon. Later, a speeding car hit the bridge's railing and plunged into the water.

The bus, traveling on the Ibrahim Babangida (Third Mainland) bridge from Idumota end of Lagos Island crossed the bridge at high speed, according to

witnesses.

Near the Adekunle end of the bridge, one of the front tyres allegedly burst. The bus tumbled over and over, flinging people out of the windows into the water.

One of the eye witnesses Mrs Iyabo Alade, said: "I was in the vehicle that was behind

the ill-fated bus. The accident was a result of the excessive speed of the driver. The bus driver lost control when one of the front tyre burst while on top speed. He stepped on the brake and it somersaulted twice before it hit the culvert."

One of the victims, a secondary school student, Kehinde Toba, including four others were reported to have jumped out of the bus when it lost control in an attempt to safe their lives, but unfortunately fell into the lagoon and died.

A nursing mother was

reported to be among those who died while her baby survived. The scene of the accident was littered with broken windscreen, shoes,
