## Teacher killed in a bid to collect N45,000 medical allowance

teacher in Bayelsa was killed by a motorist at the weekend at the Amarata suburb of Yenagoa where he had gone to collect his N45,000 medical allowance.

The motorist hit Zacharias Ezi as he was crossing a busy road in the area.

Ezi, a native of Akumoni in Yenagoa local government area of Bayelsa, died minutes after he was rushed to a nearby hospital.
