lling in opposite directions on the Suleja- Minna road when they had a head-on collision few metres from the Maje roundabout, the Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC), said.

Six other passengers in the bus were said to have been seriously injured and were rushed to the Suleja General Hospital were the dead were also deposited.

Witnesses said the Suleja local government revenue collectors had been blocking the road with sticks and nails in a bid to stop vehicles, the FRSC said.

on the opposite direction.

The Niger state Sector Commander of the FRSC, Alhaji Ambo Indabawa, confirmed the accident in an interview with our correspondent in Minna on Thursday.

He said: "this development has made it imperative for government to devise a better way of revenue collection. The idea of putting a long stick with nails as obstruction on the road in the

process of tax collection by local government officials is

to say the least, barbaric".

The 13 persons affected by the accident, which occurred at about 8pm in the night, are two women and 11 men.

Alhaji Indabawa said the

men of the National Union of Road Transport Workers (NURTW), evacuated three of the deceased to the mortuary on the night of the incident while the men of the FRSC evacuated four early in the morning of the next day.
