The deceased, according to our investigation, has since been taken back to his village at Mani Local Government of Katsina state where he would be buried accord-

ing to the Islamic rites.

The Abu Kwaka and Suleja local authorities jointly arranged the transportation of the corpse, according to the former governorship aspirant in Niger state, Mallam Habib Madaki.

Madaki said the deceased's friends insist that late Sani had taken a passenger to the Abatton and that he was never a smoker of lindian hemo-
