Nhe College of Educa tion, Jalingo and its community was thrown into mourning on Monday following the death of a female student in a kerosene explo-

student of the agric education department, was burnt to death inside a thatched hut which she rented with a fellow female student within the college neighbourhood known as

the college who survived with various degrees of burns from a similar case of kerosene explosion in the area are now receiving treatment in a clinic near the school.

Fanya Daniel, a bio-geography student of the college who lives in the same area which is mostly populated by students, told Daily Trust that the fire incident occurred in the early hours of that fateful day.

He said: "There were shouts of fire! from the hut and when we came out, we saw thick smoke and flames. We attempted to enter the hut but we couldn't", Daniel narrated. According to him, the deceased's friend and room mate, Wolsunya Zanllomi, also of the

department of Agric education

department, was later rescued due to lack of hostel accomthrough the window of the hut. modation had previously suf-We enquired about her

Ruth Ezekiel, 27, a 200 level room-mate but she could burns as a result of kerosene hardly speak because she was almost unconscious. We all thought that probably her Danladi and Japhet Francis, friend (the deceased) may have either been outside the hut or escaped unhurt."

Two other male students of Trust that it was when the hut correspondent who visited was completely burnt that the them on their sick beds that charred remains of Ruth who hailed from Donga local government area, was found on her bed. He said attempts by neighbours to put out the fire proved abortive because of the absence of men of the fire service as well as water within the college community.

> Daily Trust checks revealed that the fire which consumed the female student may have been caused by an explosion from adulterated kerosene. The two female students were said to have gone to bed the previous night after reading, leaving on a bush lantern that was powered by kerosene suspected to have been mixed with gasoline.

Daily Trust investigations further indicates that no fewer than five students of the college who live in rented huts fered from various degrees of

explosion in their huts. Two of the victims, Friday are currently being treated at the Natty Zion Medical Services, located near the col-Daniel further told Daily lege. They seperately told our the fire outbreak in which they were victims were caused by

explosions from kerosene suspected to have been adulter-

ated. As at press time the corpse of the deceased student had been conveyed to Donga for burial. The Provost of the college, Mohammed Tukur Aliyu, could not be reached as he was said to have attended the burial of a male lecturer who incidentally died the same Monday.

The public relations of-ficer of the college, Abdulkareem Bello, however, confirmed the death of Ruth saying that the Provost had earlier visited the scene of the fire incident.
