3 die as PDP, DPP clash in Sokoto

Three people were feared dead in the political violence which erupted in Sokoto yesterday as a result of clashes between PDP and DPP supporters.

All the three were slain in between the Sultan Abubakar International Airport and the Sultan Maccido Institute of Ouranic Studies, where thugs of both parties confronted one another with cutlasses, machetes and other dangerous weapons.

Although the state police commissioner has denied any killings, eye witnesses at the Birnin Kebbi Road between the state Polytechnic and Shehu Shagari College of Education, Sokoto confirmed three dead bodies in different locations.

Our reporter who was at the Birnin Kebbi Road along the overhead bridge at about 1:15 pm witnessed the killing of two people when supporters of PDP and DPP clashed under the bridge where police had to use tear gas to disperse the crowd.

The conflict was as a result of the arrival of former state governor, Alhaji Attahiru Dalbatu
