wo Nigerians were confirmed dead while two French nationals were abducted by unidentified gunmen on Saturday night at Onne, Rivers State.

The Nigerians, a man and a lady (names withheld), were shot dead by the gunmen at a popular bar known as the "Bush Bar" near the port complex in Onne, from where they equally

abducted the French men. Spokesman of the Joint Task Force in Rivers State, Lt. Col. Sagir Musa, who confirmed the attack, said hood-

lums invaded a relaxation spot near the port terminal and abducted two foreign nationals, whose identities were yet to be ascertained.

Daily Trust gathered that the abducted French nationals work as captain and third engineer respectively on the Bourbon Absara, a vessel operated by Adax Oil Nigeria

Limited Sources told our correspondent that six foreigners were inside the bar when the gunmen. who disguised as

ons of the bar, car-

ried out the deadly attack.

The sources added that the gunmen shot indiscriminately inside the bar forcing patrons inside the bar to scamper for safety and in the ensuing stampede, the Nigerian man was shot as he tried

to escape.

"Just after the man was killed, a phone held by one of the ladies inside the place rang and the gunmen opened

fire and she fell down and

"They took the two expatriates to a waiting bus outside the bar and drove to the waterside. They escaped with a speedboat after setting the bus ablaze", the source

said Lt. Col. Sagir could not, however, confirm the killing of the two Nigerians, but said that the task force was await-

ing further details of events at the bar

> "We've received reports on the attack on a joint in Onne, where two expatriates were said to have been abducted by hoodlums.

"The hoodlums went to the area in the night through the waterfront and also escaped through the waterfront. We are yet to get the identities of the hostages", he said.
