Motorist kills woman at Kagini

A middle aged woman was on Sunday knocked down by a car at Kagini junction, along Kubwa express road. According to the Kubwa Unit Commander of the Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC), Tanimu Ali Sule, the driver of a Golf car with registration number: Kaduna AX 966MKA, was driving on his lane when he suddenly noticed a motorcyclist riding against the traffic and in an attempt to avoid the cyclist, the car swerved off the road and crushed a lady that was by the road side.

He said the lady died on the spot, while her corpse was deposited at the Kubwa General Hospital's morgue.

"The motorcyclist, instead of waiting to see what he caused, rode off and was apprehended through the quick intervention of vigilantes at Kagini, who accosted the cyclist and handed him over to the Kubwa Police Division," he said.

He said the driver of the car has also been handed over to the police at Kubwa for prosecution, while his car was taken to the FRSC unit command's office at Kubwa.

Sule advised road users at Kagini in particular and Kubwa in general to desist from driving against the traffic, adding that the accident that led to the death of that innocent lady would have been prevented if the motorcyclist had kept to his own lane.

He called on motorists to assist FRSC reduce traffic accidents on the road and ensure free flow of movements on the roads.


