# Woman kills husband over children’s school fees

A polygamist’s desire to suspend the school fees of his junior wife’s children in order to gather enough money for his senior wife’s daughter’s wedding resulted in his death Tuesday as his junior wife attacked and killed him at Angwan Bokola district of Masaka.

A neighbour told our reporter that the man, Moses Maisamari had two wives but was staying with the junior one at Masaka while the senior wife stayed in the village in Kaduna State.

“Moses called his senior wife down to Masaka to prepare for the wedding of her daughter and he held a meeting that included the junior wife over the wedding arrangement,” the neighbour said.

He narrated further that while the meeting was in progress, the junior wife got up and kicked against the wedding, saying that her children’s school fees must be paid first before the wedding can hold.

“As a result of the embarrassment, Moses left for his bedroom and his wife entered along with him and the next thing that happened was that Moses screamed and rushed outside the compound before falling into unconsciousness,” he said.

He said before other neighbours could rush to Moses help, he had given up the ghost.

At the Mararaba Police Station, a police officer confirmed the incident and said the deceased person’s junior wife confessed that she held her husband’s manhood very tight in order to teach him a lesson and did not expect that it will lead to his death.

According to the police source, the woman’s husband’s corpse has been deposited at a Mortuary in Keffi, while the suspect is under police custody for discreet investigation.
