22 die in Kano accident

The wreckage of the bus

Barely a week after 22 members of a single family perished in a car crash on the Kano-Gwarzo road, another 22 persons were burnt to death in a crash that occurred on Tuesday night at Kwanar Kofa, about 62 kilometres from Kano city.

accident, which occurred around 1am, reportedly occurred due to a burst tyre on the unidentified 18- seater bus heading to Kano from Ilorin. Daily Trust learnt that the bus was conveying 28 people including the driver and conductor, out of which 19 died on the spot.

The nine survivors who sustained injuries were taken to the Murtala Mohammed Specialist Hospital, Kano. One of them however died on the way to the

hospital. At the Murtala Muhammad hospital, our reporter gathered that out of the eight persons who were admitted, two others died yesterday while three are still receiving treatment. Daily Trust learnt that the driver of the bus, who survived the crash, was taken to his hometown in Katsina State for local medication.

One of the survivors of the accident, Inusa Mohammed, told our reporter on his hospital bed that the driver was trying to escape from an on-going armed robbery on the Kaduna-Kano lane, and he drove against the traffic on the Kano-Kaduna lane.

According to Inusa, "We were travelling to Kano from Ilorin and just some kilometres to Kano, we learnt that armed robbers had blocked our lane, therefore, the driver moved to the opposite lane and all of a sudden, our tyre burst. Before one could do anything, the car somersaulted and caught fire, killing 19 people on the spot. Nine of us were rushed to the hospital"

Daily Trust further gathered that before the accident, the vehicle tyres had flat tyres on two occasions during the trip. Inusa said, "It is quite true that we had two punctures on the way but we bought another tyre and replaced the bad one."

Kano State police command public relations officer SP Baba Mohammed confirmed the accident. Kano State sector commander of the Federal Road Safety Corps, Yusuf Garba, also confirmed the accident, saying that the corps is investigating into the matter.

Garba added that the corps has established that the vehicle was carrying a motor bike which had fuel, which he said was the likely cause of the fire. According to him, "ordinarily, \ddot{a} tyre burst wouldn't have led to the fire and it has been established that the vehicle was carrying a motor cycle which led to the fire outbreak".

He added that another thing that their investigation revealed was that the vehicle was overloaded.
