## Bomb suspect may not have begun trip in Ghana

### BRT bus crushes motorcyclist in Lagos

A Lagos State government owned BRT bus yesterday crushed an unidentified okada man to death along Ikorodu road in the Lagos metropolis.

**D**aily Trust gathered that the okada man was trying to enter the lane designated solely for the BRT buses when he was crushed by the speeding bus.

A witness told Daily Trust that the okada man was crushed and dragged with his motorcycle for about 300 meters before the bus stopped.

The witness said the man might probably not have died had the BRT not been over-speeding.

When our correspondent visited the scene at the Ilupeju bus-stop yesterday, the man's corpse was being taken in an ambulance by some officials of the Lagos State Accident Emergency Agency (LASEA) to the General Hospital, Ikeja.

Expectedly, the accident caused a heavy traffic on the road as motorists slowed down to catch a glimpse. The Public Relations Officer of the Lagos Police Command Mr. Frank Mba did not pick calls made to his line yesterday by our correspondent.
