## Robbers kill 12-yr-old, two others in Jigawa

A 12-yr old boy and two others were at the weekend killed by a gang of armed robbers in Jahun town of Jahun Local Government Area of Jigawa State. The police have arrested one of the armed robbers.

According to a witness, the five-man gang attacked one Alhaji Sa'idu Danjuma, a provision dealer around 10pm. The witness added that the robbers injured three others including the owner of the shop, Alhaji Sa'idu Danjuma.

The owner of the shop was said to have engaged the armed robbers in a combat and in the process, they killed three persons including a 12-yr old boy and also injured their member.

"The armed robbers attempted to rescue the injured member of the gang, but later abandoned him and ran away", he said.

Confirming the incident to newsmen, the state Commissioner of Police Alhaji Abdullahi Salisu Fana said the injured armed robber had been arrested and that the police would get useful information that could lead to the arrest of the other robbers. He said the injured armed robber had identified himself as Muhammad Ya'u Kwanar-Huguma. He added that the two injured victims were taken to the Jahun General Hospital while the shop owner, Alhaji Sa'idu Danjuma, was rushed to the Federal Medical Centre, Birnin-Kudu.
