Three die in Jos crisis yesterday

The special task force maintaining security in Jos has confirmed that **three** persons died in a mild skirmish that occurred at Dutse-Uku area of Jos, yesterday. The skirmish was said to have started when residents of the area yesterday morning woke up to discover a corpse tied and stuffed into a sack.

The corps was confirmed to be that of Alkamata Nuhu whose father Malam Nuhu Hamza had reported that he had not seen since Friday.

The Military Special Task Force (STF) in a press statement signed by Brigadier General Oji, said, "The discovery of the corpse infuriated the locals in the area who now formed a mob and took to the street, barricading roads in the general area. And some passers-by were stabbed in the process and were evacuated to hospital where **three** of them later died".

The statement said it took the intervention of the STF who fired warning shots to disperse the mob. Four people were arrested in connection with the incident while troops with armoured tank have been deployed to the area.

The STF said another corpse was found in Kpamru area of Miango and was identified as that of Mr Weze Nhiwe, who was last seen alive on Thursday 22nd April, 2010 in company of two persons who are now in Police net.

The military however, while appealing for calm assured that they are on top of the situations.
