Maiduguri — The mutilated body of a 16 year old boy was found at the weekend in Bakin Gada River along Lagos Street in Maiduguri with his private part missing. The hands and legs of were also amputated.

The boy, Mustapha Bako Ali, from Fezzan Ward in Maiduguri, was believed to have been killed by ritualists.

Abba Muhammed, a friend of the deceased, said they normally went with Ali to swim in the river till late hours, saying he did not go on the day the incident happened but his friend was there to swim until he was discovered missing.

According to him, the father of the deceased reported last Friday that his son was missing, saying a signal was sent to the Borno Police headquarters on Saturday from the Divisional Police Officer (DPO) of the area about the body of a boy in a river bank with head and private part missing. The police spokesman said investigation on the matter was still going on and the case had been transferred to the State Criminal Investigation Department, Maiduguri .
