1 die, several injured as NURTW, police clash

Men of the State Anti -Robbery Squad (SARS) unit of the Kwara State police command at the weekend clashed with people believed to be members of the National Road Union of Road Transport Workers at Oloje garage in ilorin, leaving one person dead and several others injured.

The clash, which was said have been triggered after a motor vehicle refused to stop for check and later ran into Oloje garage and apprehended by men of SARS.

The dead person identified as Mumini, a panel beater, was alleged to have died from gunshot wounds.

The state chairman of the National Union of Road Transport Workers (NURTW) Alhaji Bashir Aliyu confirmed the incident, adding that one Mumini died and the injured had been taken to hospital.

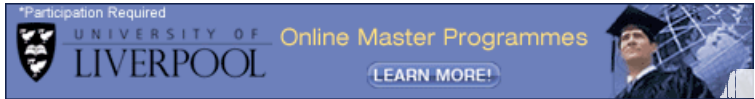
