The body of a boy, Salisu Ahmadu, who had been missing for five days was recently found in a Jos mortuary.

He was earlier arrested during a crisis with motorcycle operators.

Mother of the late Salisu, aged 27, Hajiya Yalwa, who resides in School Lane in Jos North Local Government Area of Plateau State said the body of her son was recovered from the mortuary of the Plateau Hospital on the 29th of June, about five days after he was last seen.

She said her son was last seen on the 24th June 2010 when mobile policemen arrested him while pursuing Okada riders.

Hajiya Yalwa said he was not a commercial motor cycle rider and they were told that he was kept at the "C" Division Police station but all efforts to see him failed. The mother said when she visited "C" Division and the State Criminal Investigation Department SCID both of them said they were not aware of the whereabouts of the late Salisu, until on 29th June when they discovered his corpse at the mortuary.

She said hospital officials told her that his corpse was brought to the hospital by a policeman who left his name and his number.

She said she observed that it appeared the late Salisu was beaten as there were injuries on his chest as well as two gunshot wounds in his body.

Hajiya appealed to the Federal Government and the National Assembly to investigate the extra judicial killing of her son in order to bring the perpetrators to book.

A community leader in School Lane area, Comrade Lawan Nabage, said the boy died two weeks to his wedding fatiha and the community would petition Inspector General of Police over the killing, adding that they would demand N50 million compensation.

Police Public Relations Officer in Plateau State Mohammed Lerama when contacted, said he was not aware of the case.

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
