

Mazah killings: Bereaved councilor submits to God

COUNCILLOR representing Naraguta 'B' Ward in Jos North, Plateau State, Kankani Jaja, who lost his parents and a son in the recent attack in Mazah village has said that he had left everything to God. Seven persons were killed in Mazah while several were injured. Many houses were also burnt during the attack. Jaja who spoke with our correspondent in Jos yesterday said, "There is nothing that can compensate for these losses. For me, I have left everything to God, but it is the responsibility of the state to bring the culprits to book since they committed an offence against the law of the land which I cannot interfere in." The councilor also called on the state and federal governments to come to the aid of the victims, stressing, "All of us are in a sorrowful condition considering that our houses have been burnt. The shirt I'm wearing has been on me since the night the incident happened."
