INEC to use 7,827 NYSC members for polls duties

THE Independent National Elec-Commission (INEC) Adamawa State says it will deploy no fewer than 7,827 members of the National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) as ad hoc staff for the forthcoming voter registration exercise and the 2011 elections across the 2,609 polling units in the state.

The state Resident Electoral Commissioner Alh. Kassim G. Gaidam who spoke to Daily Trust yesterday after a meeting with the local government electoral officers said NYSC has the human capacity and resolve to assist INEC in producing a credible voters' register and conducting free and fair 2011 elections.

'Adamawa INEC have only 250 staff and it needs no fewer than 7,827 trained youth corps members for the exercise, even though we are waiting for formal guidelines from the INEC national headquarters", he said. Gaidam said INEC needs at least three ad hoc staff at each polling unit. "We want to open a new chapter in terms of how best NYSC can help INEC to give Nigerians a credible voters' register and free and fair election", he said.

Youths burn 4 houses over killing of colleague
