THE Adamawa State Commissioner of Police Alhaji Adenrele T. Shinaba yesterday said two people were killed in a clash between robbers and members of Ba'ahulli village in Muchalla district in Mubi North Local Government Area of the state.

The commissioner who addressed newsmen in Yola, said one of those who were robbed the day before identified one of the suspected robbers where they were having break-fast.

He said the villagers then challenged the suspected robbers and in the process, one of the robbers brought out a dagger and injured a villager. The situation led to a clash in which

two persons were burnt to death.

He said policemen on patrol in conjunction with the villagers then stormed the enclave of the suspected robbers, where they recovered 224 stolen cows, 25 sheep, 3 goats, two single barrel guns with 31 live cartridges and N32,000.00.

In another development, the police commissioner said a 23 year old man has been arrested for allegedly raping and mutilating a 5 year old girl.
