STAFF and students of the College of Education, Ekiadolor in Edo State woke up to a rude shock yesterday when they found the blood drenched head of a student deposited in front of the school gate. It was gathered that the head whose identity was yet to be known was severed during a renewed war between rival cult groups in the institution.

The slain student was believed to have been killed in a gruesome manner as there was a gunshot wound and cutlass cut on his severed head while grasses were stuffed into his mouth.

The whereabouts of the body of the deceased **student** was not known as at press time even as the police were said to have arrested several persons in connection with the killing. The blood soaked head was later taken to the Central Hospital in Benin.

Eyewitnesses said they heard gunshots at night at the Ekiadolor village, host community of the institution only for a fresh human head to be found in front of the school gate in the morning.

Provost of the College, Professor Amen Uhunmwagho said in a telephone interview that the school authority was yet to ascertain whether the slain man was a student of the institution.

He said he would wait for police to conclude their investigations before the identity could be known.

When contacted, Edo State Police Public Relations Officer, ASP Peter Ogboi said he was yet to be briefed on the matter.
