Two rangers killed in Birnin Gwari Park

TWO rangers, working with Kamuku National Park in Birnin Gwari of Kaduna State, have been killed by gunmen suspected to be armed robbers. Confirming the incident to newsmen in Birnin Gwari yesterday, director of the park, Alhaji Abdullahi Ahmad, said a gang of armed robbers were said to have come with heavy and sophisticated weapons and attacked the unsuspecting rangers at a patrol formation in a nearby village called Dagara. The attack, which took place around 2 am on Sunday, left Ranger Lawal Nagwaggwo and Ranger Muhammad Hassan dead. Ahmad said immediately after the attack the other rangers, police and other security formations from Birnin Gwari trailed the killers while efforts were underway to arrest them.
