Two Chinese construction workers killed in Borno

-Violence in Yobe town

Gunmen yesterday killed two Chinese construction workers in Benesheikh along Maiduguri-Damaturu road in Borno State.

Witnesses said the gunmen rode in an unmarked Golf Volkswagen car and ambushed the Chinese men who were working on the Kano-Maiduguri dual carriage project.

Locals said the incident occurred around 10.30am, adding that the gunmen had taken away a Sports Utility Vehicle (SUV) belonging to the slain construction

Benesheikh is the headquarters of Kaga

Local Government Area of Borno State and is 72 kilometers away from Maiduguri.

Borno State Police Commissioner Yuguda Abdullahi said he heard of the attack and had asked his men to verify it. "I am not sure whether the Chinese men have been killed, but you can contact me later," he said.

This brings to four, the number of Chinese nationals killed in Borno State in the past months.

In neighbouring Yobe State, the Joint Task Force said riot policemen were attacked by some gunmen in Ngelzarma.

The police successfully repelled the attack and prevented the gunmen from destroying a cell phone tower, JTF Lieutenant Eli Lazarus said.

No policeman was killed during the exchange of gunfire, he added.

He said the gunmen had robbed two vehicles from civilians before they escaped but troops were trailing them.

In another incident, a JTF team in Maiduguri yesterday morning escaped a bomb explosion at a roadside in the Costain

JTF spokesman in Borno State, Lt. Col Sagir Musa, confirmed the incident, saying: "At about 8:38 today (yesterday), there was a failed IED attack on JTF patrol vehicle along Costain area of Maiduguri metropolis. An IED remote control bomb targeted at JTF vehicle was planted and buried on the road by suspected Boko Haram terrorists." He said there was no casualty.
