Nigeria: Thirteen Die in Akwanga-Jos Road Mishap

Kaduna — Thirteen people died while 10 others sustained injuries when two 18-seater buses collided in Gwantu on Akwanga-Jos road in Sanga local government Area of Kaduna State on Wednesday.

A witness said one of the vehicles with registration number FKJ 218 XD Lagos was coming from Lagos to Jos while the other one belonging to Benue Link with registration number XH 128 AKD Benue was coming from Maiduguri to Benue. The vehicles collided and plunged into a ditch.

Kaduna police spokesman Aminu Lawan confirmed the incident, saying people rushed to the scene when the accident happened and evacuated the victims to Gwantu General Hospital whose management confirmed the deaths of 13 persons.
