

Nigeria: Two Robbers Killed in Shootout With Soldiers On Kaduna-Abuja Road

The Army Headquarters Garrison said its men killed **two armed robbery** suspects in a shootout with Quick Response Group (QRG) along Kaduna-Abuja yesterday and it is looking for other robbery suspects who sustained gunshot wounds and fled after the shootout.

The garrison said any person who shows up at any health care facility or public place with gunshot wounds should be reported to the nearby security agency.

"Our QRG while responding to a distress call from trapped motorists at about 2:30am were engaged by about 10 suspected armed robbers dressed in 'haphazard' army camouflage uniforms with assault rifles," Deputy Director, Army Public Relations Lieutenant Colonel Abraham Ochagwuba said in a statement. One suspected armed robber was shot dead while another, Dauda Markus, who was shot in the stomach later, died at the **General Hospital, Suleja**.
